# **Know Your Rights. Use Your Voice.**

You probably already know a fair bit about how government works. You know about elections and how laws are made. Did you know that government in this province has a responsibility to youth? All Government Services are obligated to listen to your needs and issues...to hear what you believe should happen. If you have difficulty with any service, we may be able to help.

## What is The Advocate for Children & Youth?

The Advocate for Children & Youth helps children and youth get services they need from government, its boards, or its agencies. Staff in the office will help children and youth express their opinions and views or, if they are unable to do so, speak on their behalf.





#### **Do You Have Questions?**

- Are you having trouble getting help from government, its boards, or its agencies?
- Do you feel you have rights that are being ignored?
- Do you need a place to live and cannot find someone to help?
- Do you need help in school and do not know how to get it?
- Are you in care or custody and feel that you are not being treated fairly?

If so, call us – it's our job to help.

### But I'm Just a Teenager. Will Anyone Listen?

The Advocate for Children and Youth will listen to you. You have a right to be involved in decisions that affect you. We will help you express your opinion on issues of concern to you and find out if government policies that affect your situation are being met.

We can make sure you are listened to, your opinion is considered, and that your position is taken seriously.

#### What Happens When You Contact Us?

#### When you contact us, we will want to know:

- Your name, address, and phone number.
- What do you need help with?
- What people are involved?
- What you have done to help solve the problem?
- How you want us to help?

#### Then we may, depending on the situation:

- Give you information that will help you solve the situation yourself.
- Call someone for you and explain your problem and what you want and need.
- Meet with everyone involved and try to solve the problem.
- Investigate and ask that your problem, and the similar problem of other young people, be resolved.
